













# **WHO WE ARE**

The Clinic is legions of volunteers, community partners, and supporters throughout Rhode Island who share our belief that health care should be available for all, regardless of income.

In 2019 the Clinic provided 10,688 patient visits to 2,609 patients with the help of our dynamic statewide corps of approximately 650 volunteers and community partners, a lean professional staff of 7 full-time equivalents, and 8 AmeriCorps VISTA Members. With an annual budget of just \$1.3 million, the Clinic leveraged over \$6 million in additional donated services and medical supplies to provide vital medical care to Rhode Island's uninsured, lowincome adults and hands-on training opportunities to healthcare trainees.

## MISSION & VISION

Founded in 1999 on the core belief that healthcare should be accessible to all, Rhode Island Free Clinic's mission is to provide free, comprehensive medical care and preventive health services to adults who have no health insurance and cannot afford those services; and to serve as an educational training site for aspiring healthcare professionals.

The Clinic mobilizes vital health resources for Rhode Island's uninsured, working poor and low-income adults. The Clinic also provides the most efficient and cost effective alternative to emergency rooms for uninsured residents seeking comprehensive health care.



The Clinic provides a comprehensive patient-centered Medical Home to patients who meet the following criteria:

- Uninsured
- Rhode Island resident
- 18 years or older
- Low-income (below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level)

For a single adult earning below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, income goes to basic expenses, with not enough left for healthcare.

Even after the Affordable Care Act, nearly **50,000** Rhode Islanders have no insurance and cannot afford healthcare


