1. What is your role at the Clinic?

a. 2. How has the Clinic influenced your next step?

a. My next step after my VISTA service year will be to seek a job in non-profit management, donor relations, or communications in the Providence area. Being at the Clinic has given me an entry point into the work of non-profit management, and I have found this work to be deeply satisfying and rewarding. The Clinic has prepared me by giving me the opportunity to build my resume and begin to build a professional network.
